Small steps. Practical preparation. Keep this page where you can find it.

CHOOSE YOUR SHELTER

- ☐ Identify a basement or small interior room on the lowest floor of a sturdy building.
- ☐ Arrange access to a sturdy shelter if you live in a mobile home.
- ☐ Keep shoes, flashlights, essential medicines and head protection accessible.
- ☐ Enable warnings and identify a backup weather-alert source.

WHEN WARNED

- ☐ Move to shelter immediately; keep away from windows.
- ☐ Protect your head and neck and bring pets only if it does not delay shelter.
- ☐ Do not shelter under a highway overpass.
- ☐ Afterward, avoid debris, damaged buildings and downed lines.

SAFETY NOTE A tornado warning means act now. Mobile homes are not safe tornado shelters, even when tied down.
